We would like you to thank all of you for your patience as we were putting our policies and procedures in place and dealing with our opening in stages. By next week we will have most of our services available, although it may seem a little different.

Congratulations to Ernie Leslie on his first hole in one of his career! Expertly struck with a 9 iron on our 142 yard 5th hole.

The transfer of the roadway between #1 and #18 is very close to being finalized. Until the towns can finalize a new pathway we are going to be good neighbours and allow pedestrians to continue using the pathway, at their own risk. We need to be mindful that we need to cross Town roads with golf carts and golf equipment to access some of the golf course property.

The range will be open for practice starting on June 1. With the limited stalls, we will be reserving four spots for warm up purposes and one for lessons. Once we get on the grass tee, we should have a few more stalls for practice. We are not going to reserve the range for practice spots. Please be courteous and try to limit your practice sessions to 30 minutes or shorter during high use times. As for the putting green, we are unfortunately going to have to re-sod the green using sod from the green nursery. We are trying to schedule that in the next couple of weeks and hope to have it open by early July.

Our power carts are being shipped on June 22, with the hope they will be here and operational later that week. Thank you for your patience as we try to manage our power cart fleet as best we can. Isn't funny that the point of golf is to play the least amount possible.
