When it comes to green speeds, there's a notion that courses should aspire to the lightning-fast greens often referred to or depicted on television. Sensitive for greenskeepers and generally a misunderstood topic among golfers, here's 4 things every golfer should know courtesy of the USGA:

- 1. Green Speeds Fluctuate: Green speeds fluctuate as greens are comprised of living plants that change and perform differently from season to season, and even day to day. Temperatures, humidity, rainfall, and maintenance all influence daily green speed and truth be told it's impossible to maintain the same green speed throughout the year.
- 2. Green Speeds Don't Travel: With too many variables involved to make comparisons, green speed measurements should never be used to compare one course to another. A speed perfect for one

course may be too fast (or slow) for a course just down the road based on green contours or even golfer skill levels

- 3. Speed Costs Money: While TV broadcasts may talk a lot about green speeds, the most important part of that conversation is often left out. The sheer costs of attempting to maintain faster greens is substantial and beyond the budget of most golf courses. Everything from lawn mower heights, topdressing, and watering are factors, as well as how the greens are grown including removing trees and enhancing drainage.
- 4. Speed Can Kill: Environmental stresses like high heat and humidity can push putting green health close to the edge. Trying to maintain a particular green speed during difficult weather carries a serious risk of long-term damage as the work will impact smoothness and speed for weeks and often this preventative maintenance will slow down green speeds but preserve good playing conditions.

So, faster does not mean better. The bigger picture in golf is that speed is just one of the factors in putting green quality, just like a golfers' club path, clubhead speed, loft and more factor into our individual games.
